Nominations for 2023 DDC Officers and Board

Below is the proposed Slate of Officers and Directors for 2023 and voting will take place at the December 3rd General Membership Meeting. Positions open for nomination are: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and five Director positions which will all serve a two year term. Listed below are the minimum duties of each office, however additional duties may be assigned.

1. **President:** Preside at all business meetings, voting only as a tie breaker. Set committee chairpersons, appoint nominating committee, and perform all such duties as prescribed by the current Robert's Rules of Order, the parliamentary authority adopted by this Club.
2. **Vice-President:** Presides at business meetings in the absence of the President. In addition, shall perform all such duties as prescribed by the current Robert's Rules of Order, the parliamentary authority adopted by this Club.
3. **Secretary:** Shall keep and preserve the minutes of all meetings of the Club, maintain an accurate and complete record of the membership roster (this responsibility may be delegated to a Membership Chairperson), and respond to correspondence as directed. An attendance record is to be kept for all meetings. In addition, is to perform all such duties as prescribed by the current Robert's Rules of Order, the parliamentary authority adopted by this Club.
4. **Treasurer:** Is custodian of all monies of the Club, and handles the disbursement of funds with checks to be signed by the treasurer (or other authorized board member) or by credit card. A verbal (or written) report is to be presented at each business meeting. An accurate written report of the financial condition of the Club shall be prepared for the December meetings, and in preparation for turning over financial records to the incoming treasurer. In addition, is to perform all such duties as prescribed by the current Robert's Rules of Order, the parliamentary authority adopted by this Club.
5. **Directors:** Contribute to the leadership of the Club and may be requested to fill assorted responsibilities as set forth in Standing Rules which are listed in the By Laws.

Board meetings are held bimonthly via Zoom format and as needed to conduct business. The Club also tries to hold three General Membership meetings per year (February, September, and December).

Proposed By Laws Changes

The By Laws Committee has proposed the following changes to the current DDC By Laws. These changes, marked in red, italic print, will be voted upon by the General Membership on December 3, 2022. If you have any questions or concerns about these changes, please contact Anna Klumpp, John Layton, or Diane Savage.

Article III—Members

A) Applications for membership should follow the prescribed procedures:

1. A completed and signed application accompanied by annual dues amount should be submitted to the Membership Chairperson. ***The Chairperson will notify the applicant upon acceptance by email or letter.***

C) Budgets

1. Prior to the December meeting, the outgoing Board will prepare a proposed Budget for the upcoming year. At minimum, the Budget will include all anticipated operational expenses, such as insurance costs, newsletter expenses, etc., and the estimated income from membership dues ***and club activities generating income such as the Pleasure Show, merchandise sales, donations, etc.*** The proposed Budget will be presented at the December meeting and must be approved by the incoming Board

Article IV.—Finances

A) Dues and Fees

1. Determination of the dues for the upcoming year shall be set by the ***quorum of*** eligible members in attendance at the December meeting, following discussion of the anticipated operational expenses and budget for the upcoming year. Dues should be set, at minimum, to cover operational expenses. ***Votes will be cast by ballot (?)***.

Article V.—Officers

The Officers of the Club are: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and five Directors.

Together this is considered the Board

- A) Each Officer will ***be elected to serve a two year term***. Each Officer must have been a member for at least one year at the time of nomination.
- B) Each Director is elected for a two year term, and must have been a member for at least one year at the time of nomination.
- C) Term Limits: Officers and Directors will be limited to two consecutive terms. The candidate may seek reelection of that Office after one year has passed or seek election of another position during any election period.***
- D) Elections will be held during each December meeting. In preparation for this election, a nominating committee will be named by the President, and the slate must be presented to the membership via the newsletter at least one month prior to the December meeting. Additional nominations for each office may be made at the meeting.
- E) Voting is done by ballot and no proxy or absentee votes are permitted. Members may also join the meeting in-person, via webcam or video conferencing camera and/or phone to vote.***

Proposed By Laws Changes, cont.

Article VI.—Meetings

General Meetings shall be held ***either in person or electronically a minimum of three times a year (February, September, and December)*** with a focus on education, demonstrations, and socialization as well as official club business. Board meetings shall be scheduled for the first Thursday of ***every other month*** or as close to that day as possible. The date, time, and locations of the meetings shall be announced in the newsletter. Meetings shall be conducted in accordance to the current Robert's Rules of Order, the parliamentary authority adopted by this Club.

- A) A quorum equal to 1/10th of the paid membership as of January 31 each year shall be required to conduct official business.
- B) ***Bimonthly*** Board Meetings shall include the reading and approval of minutes from the proceeding meeting.
- C) Special meetings may be called by the Board when deemed necessary. Members will be notified of the date, time, and place, and the purpose of the meeting a minimum of two weeks in advance of the meeting ***via club email***

Article VII.—Committees

Committees are established on an as-needed basis by the President, as either a Standing Committee or an Ad-Hoc Committee. Standing Committees are established to address long-term or recurring issues or needs and will generally remain in effect for a longer duration than Ad-Hoc Committees. Ad-Hoc Committees are established to address one-time or short-term issues or needs. All committees shall have a Chairperson, appointed by the President. Committees may be dissolved when the issue or need has been resolved.

Standing Committees:

By Laws Committee to review and/or revise By Laws each September for approval by the General Membership in December

Trailer Committee to handle the logistics of the Club Trailer

Show Committee Chairperson and Co-Chairperson—the Chairperson may be reappointed annually by the President and serve at the pleasure of the Board. The Co-Chairperson will serve a one year term to understudy the process of Chairperson prior to consideration of appointment as Chairperson.

Nominating Committee to prepare an annual Slate of Officers prior to the December election

Article VIII. - Amendments

This Constitution and these By-Laws may be amended by a 2/3 vote of the quorum of the membership at any ***General Membership*** meeting.

Standing Rules

The President shall solicit volunteers to handle such duties as Newsletter editor/publisher, ***Webmaster***, Education Leader, Safety Officer, Sunshine ***Chairperson***, ***Membership Chairperson***, and Historian.

Proposed By Laws Changes, cont.

Standing Rules, cont.

A membership roster is to be prepared and distributed to members as soon after January 31 as possible.

Members will be directed to a Resource Person (typically webmaster) to obtain information and receive guidance/answers to driving and equestrian related inquiries via the website or social media.

Members will be directed to the Trailer Committee regarding inquiries for the use of the Club Trailer. Archives shall be stored in the trailer, except for the items that are heat or cold sensitive, such as video tapes, photographs, ***and electronics.***

All members are given a copy of the Club By-Laws and a Membership Roster immediately upon becoming a member or as soon after as is possible. Members who do not have a copy of the By-Laws should contact the Secretary to receive their copy.

Members should submit acknowledgements of a member's illness, death, or other concern including events to be celebrated with an appropriate card to ***the Sunshine Chairperson.*** Exceptions to this rule shall be voted upon by the general membership or directors as occasions require.

The By Laws are our set of rules and principles that govern the structure and operation of our Driving Club. As with any document, it is time to refresh them and ensure that they are appropriate for the way our Club does business. Please read these changes carefully and be prepared to discuss them at the December General Membership Meeting.

Joy of Driving

This past month has been busy for our members who participated in a wide variety of driving classes, events, and competitions. They truly show why driving is such a joy!



For many years the Garden State CDE has been held at the Horse Park of New Jersey in October. This year was one of several firsts for DDC Members John and Colleen Layton and Kate Pantelione. John was presented a Special Award for surviving his first year as a Garden State CDE Committee Member. This award was well deserved as he worked very hard to help organize and promote the 2022 Garden State CDE. Since New Jersey is a geographic epicenter of harness racing, breeding, and training and Standardbreds are a very versatile breed, John and Colleen decided to approach the Horse Park of New Jersey regarding hosting a first ever exhibition division for Standardbreds at the CDE. This venture resulted in a record number of entries! In addition to his promoting and organizing duties, John participated in the Training Level with his Cleveland Bay named Eris K. His navigator was Crit Stoltzfus, from Yonie's Harness, who thoroughly enjoyed his first time as a 'gator'. The team of John, Crit, and Eris K worked very well together, despite not placing. In fact, Yonies Harness declared Saturday a Holiday so they could watch the Marathon part of the competition. Upon completion of the CDE John was asked to present the Champion and Reserve Champion Awards to the USEF 2022 Preliminary Division Winners for Single Horse and Single Pony.



A little over a year ago, a Standardbred named Ideal Kiss ended his racing career. He was a good pacer who made a lot of money for a lot of people and was claimed a total of 27 times (which meant 27 different owners, drivers, trainers, and homes). As luck would have it, Ideal Kiss landed at his forever home—the Laytons. Colleen felt he would make a great Combined Driving prospect for her and decided to compete in the Standardbred Division at the Garden

State CDE. As Ambassadors for the Standardbred Division, John and Colleen held several information sessions at the Horse Park, other parks, and competitors farms and acted as a liaison to the USEF who prepared information for the competitors and participated in course walks and answered a myriad of questions from and provided guidance to the competitors to help them get started. Colleen and Kiss scored a fifth place win in the Standardbred Division and were thrilled with their first ever CDE competition.



Kate Pantelione stepped up to help a fellow standardbred owner by driving her horse when the owner had to have unexpected surgery and was unable to drive. During the past several years, she has groomed, navigated, and driven many carriage miles. This was her first ever CDE as a driver and Kate won a 4th place award! In addition, she navigated for every new-to-a-CDE driver in the exhibition division and taught them the ropes of getting through a

simple hazard. For this reason she was presented with the Golden Gator Award from Stafford Carriage Driving for the Standardbred Exhibition Division. Everyone is so proud of Kate for her efforts to promote driving and educate future combined driving enthusiasts!

Autumn Risks to Horses

The leaves are turning wonderful shades of brown, gold and red and autumn is a perfect time to get out driving your horse. However there are some hazards to be aware of this time of year. With leaves and seeds falling from the trees, this is the time when horses are most at risk from possible poisoning from sycamore seeds and acorns. The advice to horse owners is generally to fence off the area containing the offending tree and remove any acorns, sycamore seeds, leaves and seedlings from their grazing.

How can you protect your horse?

Horse owners are advised to take practical steps to prevent the diseases by limiting access to sycamore seeds and acorns:

- Identify trees both around grazed fields as well as those in close proximity. The characteristic maple leaf shape is easy to spot, and most people will be familiar with the oak, but if in doubt ask your county Extension Office or Farm Bureau.
- Collect seeds or exclude horses from affected areas using electric fencing or stabling.
- Feed supplementary hay to try and prevent horses from excessive foraging for short blades of grass and inadvertent ingestion of seeds. But ensure that hay does not become contaminated by seeds.
- Don't rashly fell trees when laden with seeds as this can cause a sudden and massive contamination of the pasture.
- Monitor horses carefully even after they have been moved from affected pasture as disease can occur up to four days after exposure

How Much Turnout Does your Horse Like?

Stabling and turnout practices are dependent upon many factors. These include owner preferences, setup of the barn, number of horses, size of paddocks, availability of outdoor shelter, sources of food and water, gender mix, as well as the health and work requirements of individual horses.

It seems that a lot of horses are kept in stalls most of the time, with many stables limiting turnout to a fraction of the day and keeping horses inside during the night and in cold weather. This makes sense based on our human schedules and needs. But does it make sense when considering the different sleeping and eating schedules between humans and horses? Taking a look at turnout from a horse's perspective helps us to re-ask some fundamental questions:

1. How much turnout is optimal for my horse?
2. What time of day or night is the best for turnout? Does this vary with the season and weather conditions?
3. What weather conditions, if any, should my horse be kept in?

Some answers to consider for your situation may include:

Turning out your horses on a regular basis allows them to maintain their health through exercise, play, and social interaction with other horses. Research has also shown that horses require at least **8 to 10 hours of turnout per day**, on good quality pasture, to achieve the minimum dry matter intake of 1% of their body weight. The recommended dry matter intake for an average horse is 1.25% to 2% of their body weight daily. Studies have shown that a horse left to his own devices will chose to spend most of his time outside. One horse can be maintained on: ½ acre pasture, if turnout is less than 3 hours per day. 1 acre pasture, if turnout is 3 – 8 hours per day.

The most important thing to consider is your horse's welfare and happiness.
