


### **USEF Fan Membership**

## DIY Corner—Dress Warm for Cold Days!!!

Whether you're heading outdoors for chores or some good winter fun with your equines—here are some hints to help you stay toasty warm and dry.

**A hat that covers your ears**—less heat lost from the head keeps your whole body warmer. Acrylic and wool each have properties ideal for a warm winter hat. ... Hats with higher acrylic material are less prone to shrinkage. Hats with more wool content keep the head dry

**A scarf or neck warmer that can cover your face and mouth** - it creates a form of insulation and a pocket of warm air.



**Mittens or Insulated Gloves**—Mittens tend to be warmer than gloves and can be used when doing barn chores. Insulated gloves with some type of waterproofing are best—some people also like the hot hand packs but the heat doesn't usually reach the finger tips. Silk, gore-tex, or thinsulate lining in gloves is also very helpful

**Boots or Shoes that are Insulated and Water-resistant or Waterproof**—to keep your toes warm, use wool or synthetic (thinsulate) socks. Make sure there is significant tread to prevent slips and absorb shock.

A Base Layer of Wool, Silk or Synethics - this is critical because it lies directly against your skin. Choose material that is breathable and quick-drying, with good wicking (transport of moisture away from your skin to the garment's outer surface, where it is released through evaporation). Avoid cotton, as it absorbs moisture but will not wick, leaving you chilled, but instead consider a synthetic fabric, such as polyester or polypropylene. (they don't provide much in the way of warmth though, so you may have to beef up your middle and outer layers. Certain natural fibers, such as silk or wool are also good choices for base layers. However, even the finest wool may be irritating to sensitive skin. Silk, when treated with a wicking compound, is breathable, comfortable, and manages moisture well, though not as quickly as polyester.

A Middle Layer of Wool, Down, or Fleece—Natural fibers trap heat close to your body better than synthetics.

**An Outer Layer that's Water and Wind-Resistent** -Look for a jacket in a waterproof material with a high neck, vents, and fasteners at the wrist. Ensure it's safe to wear – not slippery, bulky, billowy, or noisy. Also make sure you choose garments that button or zip in front, rather than those that pull off over your head, so you can peel off layers easily if you become overheated.

**Don't Forget these Details**—A few thoughtful extra details can also help keep you from rushing back to the house too quickly – like the small, chemical heat packs commonly found in hardware or drug stores. Having a thermos of hot coffee, tea, or cocoa handy to sip on before, during, and after your ride can help keep your core temperature up.
