



A Sporting Day of Traditional Driving



On Saturday, September 26th DDC Members Frances and Wayne Baker generously shared their Hollyville Farm for a Sporting Day of Traditional Driving Show. This competition is a relatively young sport in the United States – it was introduced by the Carriage Association of America over 15 years ago and based on the popular European event known as Attelage de Tradition. It consisted of three phases: Turnout Inspection, a Country Drive with seven driving tests or challenges, and a Cones Course. There were ten entries - the equine entries consisted of a pair of Canadian Crossbreds, two VSEs, four ponies, and three horses. The antique vehicle entries included a Back to Back

Pony Trap, a Spider Phaeton, a Wicker Phaeton, a Gig, and a Road Cart and the other vehicles were a Wagonette Break, a Meadowbrook Cart, and three Easy Entry Carts. DDC Member George Parris was the Turnout Judge, the Cones Course was designed and timed by Lisa and Alan Shiells, and the participants had their grooms to act as Judges during the Country Drive section. After the competition, participants and volunteers enjoyed lunch followed by the presentation of awards (ribbons). With so many positive comments following the competition, maybe this event will become an Annual Affair. Thanks go to the Participants, Volunteers and most of all the hosts — Frances and Wayne Baker who shared their farm as the event site and provided boxed lunches and

gift bags for everyone. Their generosity and support is much appreciated and it made this event wonderful on every level!.
